


LIST KSIĘDZA PROBOSZCZA

Drodzy Parafianie i Przyjaciele

Scena, którą kontemplujemy dziś w Ewangelii stawia przed nami intymną relację, która istnieje między Jezusem Chrystusem i Ojcem; ale nie tylko to, zaprasza nas ona również do odkrycia relacji między Jezusem i Jego uczniami. «A gdy odejdę i przygotuję wam miejsce, przyjdę powtórnie i zabiorę was do siebie, abyście i wy byli tam, gdzie Ja jestem.» (J 14,3): te słowa Jezusa nie tylko stawiają uczniów w perspektywie przyszłości, ale też zapraszają ich do pozostańia wiernym drodze, którą przedsięwzięli. Aby dzielić z Panem życie pełne chwały, muszą podzielić też tę samą drogę, która prowadzi Jezusa do mieszkania Ojca.

W tym zaproszeniu, które składa nam Jezus, by iść do Ojca poprzez Niego, z Nim i w Nim, ukazuje się Jego najbardziej intymne pragnienie i Jego najgłębsza misja: «Ten, który dla nas stał się człowiekiem, będąc jedynym Synem, chce uczynić nas swoimi braćmi i, w tym celu, zanosi prawdziwemu Ojcu swoje własne człowieczeństwo, a razem z nim wszystkich tej samej natury» (Św. Grzegorz z Nyssy). Droga, którą się idzie, Prawda, którą się głosi, Życie, aby się nim dzielić i cieszyć: Jezus Chrystus.

The month of May is the "month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady," and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world [pay] to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the *Month of May*, no. 1). This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time. In the 16th century,

books appeared and fostered this devotion. The practice became especially popular among the members of the Jesuit Order — by 1700 it took hold among their students at the Roman College and a bit later it was publicly practiced in the Gesu Church in Rome. From there it spread to the whole Church.

The practice was granted a partial indulgence by Pius VII in 1815 and a plenary indulgence by Pius IX in 1859. With the complete revision of indulgences in 1966 and the decreased emphasis on specific indulgences, it no longer carries an indulgence; however it certainly falls within the category of the First General Grant of Indulgences. (A *partial indulgence* is granted to the faithful who, in the performance of their duties and in bearing the trials of life, raise their mind with humble confidence to God, adding — even if only mentally — some pious invocation.

About the Jubilee Book of the Father Zbigniew Tyburski

Common wisdom says: *Whoever plans for the year sows the grain; who plans for ten years - plants trees; who plans for a hundred years - raises a human being.*

During ancient times, it was previously already understood clear and distinct that the most valuable issue in the society of polis is the paideia of man. The process of education called *paideia* (gr.) combined truth, goodness and beauty. These values, enriched by divine revelation, form the foundations of philosophy, ethics and aesthetics in Christianity. The development of moral virtues and education for eternal life are inclusive here.

Personalism, which started in the 20th century on Christian grounds, perceives man as a person (*persona* from Latin). The personal model of upbringing takes into account the overall, bodily and spiritual dimension of the human person, called to create social bonds based on love and freedom. This new approach to man as a person was practiced in the teaching by Pope John Paul II. He had good contact with people on all continents.

In modern pedagogical viewpoints, there is a belief that man as a person develops throughout his life until old age. The American psychologist John McLeish describes adulthood metaphorically as "the age of Odysseus," where the theme of the journey becomes a symbol of human maturation.

The family plays the most important role in human development. It is there that a child, and then an adult, discovers his personal identity. Teresa Kukulowicz, a professor of the Catholic University of Lublin, who died in 2014 claimed that only experiencing oneself and discovering one's worth in the family leads to understanding another person.


All the works of Fr. Stanisław Staszic (1755-1826), mentioned in this book, were inspired by his concern for the development of man and society. His pedagogical views deserve special attention, he was inclusive of the concept of comprehensive education of children and adolescents, with an emphasis on moral issues. In his work *The Human Family* (1819-1820) he laid out philosophical views as well as the essence and genesis of morality. Although he included elements such as patriotism, knowledge of the mother tongue or deep humanism among the factors of moral education, the most important thing was the authority of the family. He taught that no one can replace a child's parents in shaping the sensitivity of the heart and mind. He believed that the basis of interpersonal relations should be love for people, who are to be respected due to their characteristics, such as diligence, honesty, reliability, and not for their social origin or positions in social life. He emphasized that moral education helps an individual to reach maturity, and thus influences the multiplication of the nation's spiritual good.
